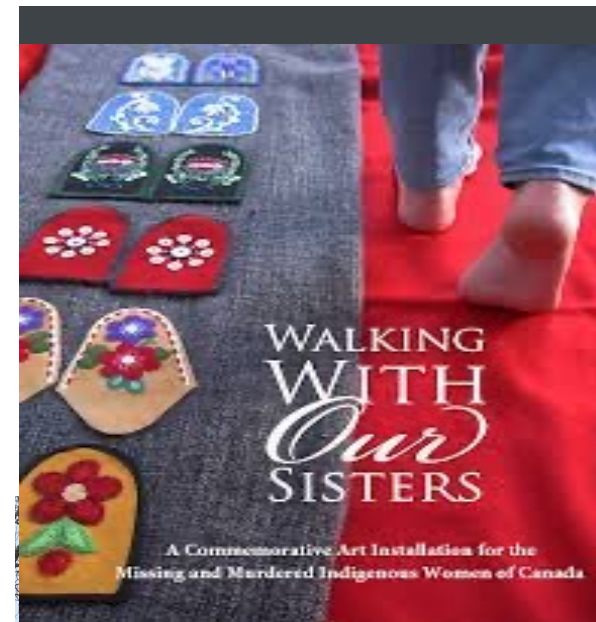

TIPI LEGACY TOUR

- Walking With Our Sisters (WWOS), was a commemorative art installation of 1800+ pairs of moccasin vamps (Tops), created and donated by hundreds of caring and concerned individuals to draw attention to the Murdered and Missing Women and the Two Spirited people across Canada.
- The tour travelled across Canada and into the United States, bringing awareness for the unfinished lives of 1800+ Missing & Murdered Women & Girls.
- After the event, the committee talked about what type of legacy could be developed to commemorate the Walking With Our Sisters event.
- We came up with a Tipi Tour, where we build forever tipis of which there is a teaching on each of the tipis throughout the city of Brandon.

TIPI Locations:

Brandon Police Service (1020 Victoria Ave.) AKITCHITA– This tipi's teaching is on the Seven Sacred Teachings and the importance of the warrior in society.

Brandon City Hall (410-9th St.) –The teaching for this tipi speaks to the symbolism of each of the poles making the tipi.

Brandon University (270-18th St.) –The teaching speaks about the Walking With Our Sisters Event.

Riverbank Discovery Centre (1-545 Conservation Dr.) –The teaching describes the 4 elements: Air, Water, Fire and Earth.

Assiniboine Community College North Hill Campus (1035-1st St.) –This tipi teaches about Indigenous Education and Protocols

Assiniboine Community College East Campus (1430 Victoria Ave. East) –The teaching on this tipi is about Indigenous Knowledge and Knowing.

Green Acres School, Brandon School Division (1031-6th St.)–This Tipi has teachings about Healing.

Global Market (23-12th St.) –Teachings on this Tipi speak to traditional foods that were part of the Indigenous Peoples diet before colonization.

Elsbeth Reid Family Resource Centre (255-9th St.) –This tipi speaks to reconciliation within the family.

Tipi Locations:

Prairie Mountain Health (Near 504 Russel St.) –The teaching on this Tipi speaks on the four Sacred Medicines; Sage, Cedar, Tobacco and Sweet Grass.

Errol Black Park (Near 123 Rosser Ave. East) Two Tipis at this location, close together.

1. **Manitoba Metis Federation Tipi**–speaks about the history of Metis people.
2. **Indigenous Veteran's Tipi**– Speaks about the history of Indigenous Veterans.

Riverview School (1105 Louise Ave. East)– This tipi speaks about Oral Teachings.

Brandon Correctional Centre (375 Veteran's Way) – This Tipi has teachings about Resiliency.

Knox United Church (451-18th St.)– This Tipi speaks on the meaning of Truth & Reconciliation.

Brandon Friendship Centre (205 College Ave.) –The teachings on this Tipi is focused on the Medicine Wheel.

Crocus Plains Regional Secondary School (1930 1st St.)–This Tipi speaks on Youth & Elders.

Riverview School (1105 Lousie Ave. E)–This Tipi teaches the importance of Oral teachings.

Keystone Centre (1175 18th St.)– This tipi speaks on the importance of Gatherings.

Stanley Park (1410 Princess Ave.)–This tipi speaks to Missing & Murdered Women & Girls.
